

ORDINANCE NUMBER ONE


AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE VISIBILITY OF DRIVE-IN THEATER MOTION PICTURE
SCREENS TO OPERATORS OF MOTOR VEHICLES UPON STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

In accordance with authority conferred under Section 153-9(55) of the General Statutes of North Carolina as amended, and under Senate Bill 100 as ratified by the North Carolina Legislature on February 1, 1973; and

For the purpose of abating those nuisances on private property controlled by drive-in theaters which would interfere with the safety of motorists and other users of public streets and highways, and for the purpose of supervising, regulating, suppressing, or prohibiting such nuisances in the interest of public morals, comfort, safety, convenience, and welfare;


NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the County of Scotland do ordain as follows:

1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation operating a drive-in motion picture theater to establish, operate, or maintain a theater screen in the vicinity of any public street or highway in such manner that the surface of such theater screen upon which pictures are being projected is visible to any person operating a motor vehicle upon such street or highway. Each time pictures are projected on such theater screen shall be considered as a separate offense.
2. If any person, firm, or corporation shall violate this ordinance, he shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), or imprisoned not more than thirty days.
3. This ordinance shall apply throughout the county, except that such ordinances shall not be applicable within the corporate limits or jurisdiction of any municipality which has conducted the most recent election required by its charter or the general law, whichever is applicable, unless the governing body thereof shall, by resolution, agree to such ordinance.
4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the 5th day of March, 1973.




