Scotland County Parks and Recreation Geocaching Guidelines

These guidelines are applicable to geocach hidden in Scotland County Parks.

- 1. When hiding, finding, and trading items in a geocach you are subject to all applicable federal, state, and local laws including park hours.
- 2. All geocaches should be hidden according to the Geocaching.com Cache Listing Requirements / Guidelines published at http://www.geocaching.com/about/guidelines.aspx
- 3. Geocaches are prohibited on any sports field in a Scotland County park.
- 4. Geocaches are prohibited in any landscaped area or plant bed in a Scotland County Park.
- 5. Use common sense. Don't hide a geocach in an area that will present a danger to others who might be looking for it or to park or greenway visitors who are unaware of the sport. This includes, but is not limited to, activities such as burying a geocach, or leaving a geocach in a tree.
- 6. Stay on trails. The trails are there to provide access to sensitive areas, but limit the impact of visitors on those areas.
- 7. No dangerous objects, knives, food or illegal substances may be in geocach in County parks.
- 8. Scotland County Parks and Recreation reserves the right to confiscate any geocach found on park property, for any reason. The County is in no way responsible for any damage to or loss of geocach or equipment that is caused by others. The County is in no way liable for injuries associated with searching for or hiding a geocach.
